



CHECKLIST

Travelling with four-legged friends



BEFORE THE TRIP

No question, your four-legged friends have to come along when you go on holiday! To make your trip as stress-free as possible, you should get your pet used to long car journeys before. Also check your route for pet-friendly campsites or holiday accommodation and have your pet approved there. To avoid unpleasant surprises, you should inform yourself in advance about the conditions in the respective destination country as well as the safety precautions during the journey. Also important: don't forget to have the necessary border documents issued and packed! If your pet needs medication, you should of course take it with you.

IMPORTANT

Many things actually go without saying: For example, taking regular breaks, avoiding draughts and always providing fresh drinking water. Never leave your pet alone in the car. If it is necessary, open the window a crack and return to the car after 15 minutes at the latest. At your destination, find out where the nearest veterinary practice is just to be on the safe side.
